



Mustang/Steyr 2250 Walkaround

Mustang Boats (small) have been steadily working away from their factory at Hope Island for quite a few years now.

Their range has remained much the same, with the company focusing on their mid size cruisers, the 2200 Clubsport, 2400 Clubsport and 2300 Bowrider. Their range of fishing boats has remained at the wayside, and only recently have they started to focus on these boats.

The 2250 Walkaround, is a reworked version of their 2150 model, with quite a few changes, including an all-new hull, featuring more pronounced reverse chines to



make it a drier boat.

The 2250 is a big, beamy-hulled boat, with deep sides and plenty of depth in hull. The 18 degree in the transom hull, is one not too dissimilar to the original Haines Hunter 680SF, which this boat reminds the writer of very much. It is also a fairly weighty boat, partly due to the construction techniques, making it a strong boat. Aimed squarely at the serious offshore fishing market, the boat was designed with blue water in mind, and in particular, coastal fishing. The large walkaround configuration,
